




It is located in Southern Serbia, on mount **Radan** not far from the town of **Kuršumlija**. It comprises of more than 200 stone formations, 2 to 15 meters high and up to 3 meters wide, with strange stone caps.

Djavolja Varoš consists of two rare phenomena:


- 1. Attractive stone formations created by erosion
- 2. Two springs of extremely acid water with high mineral content.

Đavolja Varoš was a nominee in the New Seven Wonders of Nature campaign.


Despite not being elected the new wonder, it attracts numerous tourists looking for adventure and mystery.







According to one legend, these formations are actually petrified wedding guests who, on devil's orders, wanted to marry a brother and sister. Then God punished them by turning them into stone to stand as a reminder that no sin goes unpunished.






Church of St. Petka
