

The Ulm Munster


- highest bell-tower in the world

- built and financed by the citizens of Ulm



The Fisher's District




- majority of buildings preserved
- most buildings are from the 15th to 17th century
- was populated by fishers, rivermen and tanners
- it's idyllic and ideal for a calming walk



Ulm Town Hall

- originally an exchange
- upper floor has long been used as a chamber for the city administration




Central Library

- accessible to everyone during opening hours




The Danube

- built in the 17th century
