- It has an area of 238,398 km2




IN THE CARPATO-DANUBIANO-PONTIC AREA

- 2/3 of the Carpathian Mountains are on the territory of Romania
- the lower part of the Danube river (1075 km) is on the territory of Romania or represents parts of the border sector with the states of Serbia, Bulgaria
- it has access to the Black Sea, the length of the Romanian coast being 245 km



VARIOUS RELIEF: APPROXIMATELY 30% MOUNTAINS, 40% HILLS AND PLATEAU, 30% PLAINS



CLIMATE

- Average annual temperatures decrease slightly from the south (10°-11°C) to the north (8.5°-9°C)
- Also, the temperature decreases with increasing altitude (by 6° for every 1000 m.)
- Average annual maximum temperatures range between 22°C and 24°C in summer and between -3°C and -5°C in winter

WATERS

- A) Running waters most rivers spring from the Carpathian Mountains (Mureş, Prut, Siret, Timiş, Argeş, etc.)
- B) Lakes occupy 1.1% of Romania's territory (Bucura, Red Lake, Vidraru, Ocnele Mari, Techirghiol, etc.)

VEGETATION

- Distributed in tiers, in accordance with the soil, climate and altitude
- From oak, dogwood, linden, ash to spruce, fir, pine, juniper, alpine meadows










FAUNA


- the rabbit, the grebe, the grouse, the reptiles, the pheasant, the grouse, the quail, the carp, the crucian carp, the pike, the shad, the catfish;
- for the floor of deciduous forests (oak and beech): wild boar, wolf, fox, brown bear, barbel, woodpecker, finch;
- for the floor of conifer forests: trout, loach, lynx, deer, and specific to the alpine fauna are black goats and eagles.
