Today, I'll give you three different examples of the many trips I've taken this





1.Guided Tour "Culture intertwines with Nature " in Cluj Napoca Botanical Garden

In this free guided tour organized by the Botanical Garden on October 1st, the International Seniors' Day, a lady botanist presented the garden from a different perspective, that of culture. She described us the many statues there are here and their history, how they came to be placed








1.Guided Tour "Culture intertwines with Nature" in Cluj Napoca Botanical Garden

The Botanical Garden in Cluj is famous for its very large number of plant varieties, over 10.000, and cooperates with many botanical gardens abroad in the exchange of seeds, including the Botanical Garden in Ulm.







On this trip I went with friends from my hiking group and stayed in a villa in a village at the foothills of the mountains. We also benefited from the pleasant company of a kitty called Botosel (white shoes).







Here,in the Land Oltenia under the Mountain we visited Buila Vânturarița National Park which is going to become a UNESCO Geopark under the name of "Oltenia under the mountain". This area is also known for pottery, Horezu ceramics being inscribed on the UNESCO intangible heritage list.




. As the pottery exhibition from Horezu was closed when we got there, we could still see the clay pots arranged according to the craftsmen who created them on the large windows of the building



Here there are a lot of monasteries: Arnota, Bistrita (painted by Gheorghe Tattarescu, a famous Romanian painter – in my opinion it is a monastery exhibition), Hurezi registered in UNESCO intangible heritage list., Patrunsa, Surpate, Dintr-un Lemn, etc.)








At the Patrunsa (Penetrated in English) monastery, situated at the top of the mountain, which can only be reached only on foot over a distance of 7 km or by donkeys, we were impressed by the way the firewood is stored for the winter







In the village of Costesti where we stayed we saw that in the yard of each villager there was, besides the house, a barn with animals, which above have a hayloft where the hay, the basic food for cows, sheep, goats, is stored in good conditions







In Oltenia under the mountain, in old times, the hostile attacks of the Turks coming from across the Danube or of the outlaws coming down from the woods stopped in the strong walls of the fortified rich men houses, named <u>"cule".</u>







3.Thematic Trail "The Path of the Partisans from Apuseni Mountains"

- History and democracy brought us together connecting through a recent thematic travel, more exactly on 5 October, at the inauguration of the thematic memorial trail The Way of the Partisans in the Apuseni (Sunset in English) Mountains, a tribute to the anti-communist struggle in the Apuseni Mountains, part of the Western Carpathians, in Transylvania,.
- The Apuseni Partisan Trail is a memorial-thematic trail, being the first of its kind in Romania, and became part of the Ecomuseum of Motilor (the name of people living in this area) Mountains.
- It is in the form of a 10-kilometers circuit and is dotted with 9 stops with panels that capture the story of the "Shusman" Group and the Mounts who resisted the communist dictatorship.
- As part of the inauguration event, **a hike of medium difficulty took place**, attended by lovers of history and democracy. The trail passes through places of remembrance where the partisans fought and died.

The event was also attended by Her Royal Highness Princess Sofia, great-great-granddaughter of the **king Ferdinand** of Romania.

In 1925, Teodor Şuşman, the later <u>leader</u> of the partisan group in Apuseni Mountains, was received in audience, as a representative of the Mounts, by King Ferdinand of Romania, the great-grandfather of Princess Sofia. After this meeting, the villages of the Apuseni were to be provided with forests and grass lands..

The Partisans' trail even has digital support: interactive GPS map (this map that can also be used for not getting lost in the dense forest in areas where there is no internet signal by downloading the application specially created for this trail) and audio illustrations for each stop, which are made by actors and can be activated by QR code.




